Greetings to the followers of Christ at First Congregational UCC,

I am Rev. Michael Safford-Kennedy, you can call me "Pastor Mike." I am looking forward to joining with you in our time of change, learning, and discovering

Interim Ministry. I am eager to meet all of you, hear your stories and your love for our church. I begin my journey with you on Monday, March 3, with my first time in our pulpit March 9.

I come to you after serving churches in Columbus, NE, Greenwood, WI, Chilton, WI, and New Holstein, WI. More than that I bring with me all the experiences of a life lived with twists and turns, joy and sadness. I am coming to travel with you in our next adventure.

First, the basics; I am widowed, father of three adult children, stepfather to three more adult children, grandfather to two boys and step-grandfather to another three. Raising our three children with my first wife, we said they could move anywhere when they found their careers. They took us literally. They live in Milwaukee, Marquette, MI, and Elkhorn, NE. Contrast this with my wife Sue. She told her kids they also could live anywhere their careers took them...as long as they stayed within five miles of her. The three of them all live within the Fox Valley. All six of them are well established in their communities and thriving.

My early adult life centered on engineering. I spent six years in the Navy. I was stationed aboard the U.S.S Mississippi CGN-40 a nuclear-powered guided missile cruiser whare I was a reactor operator. (If I had to live

my life again, I would again join the Navy in the blink of an eye.) After the Navy I earned an electrical engineering degree and went to work for Nebraska Public Power District in Columbus, NE. While in Columbus I experienced my call to the ministry.



Rev. Bruce Carlson encouraged me to explore the call. He led me through the early stages exploring what my call might encompass. After a couple of years, I entered seminary at United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities, Minneapolis, MN. I graduated in the spring of 2002. While at seminary I met my future wife Susan Safford-Gaul.

Sue and I were married October 16, 2006, at Faith United Methodist Church in Brillion, WI. Sadly, after

just 16 years she died on Thanksgiving Day 2022. She was just 62. She was a UMC minister serving churches throughout eastern Wsconsin. There you have it, a thumbnail telling of my life story, so far.

I have met a few of the members of our church. They have been most hospitable, filled with energy and eager to move into the interim between your previous pastor and your future settled pastor. I see this time as an opportunity to take stock of who you were, who you are now and who you want to be in the future. Interim times are gifts from our loving God. We can ask questions and gain insights regarding ourselves and the church. It is also a time to breathe, to discover new possibilities. Interim times allow us the gift of time, the time it takes to rediscover our likes and dislikes, what ministries we seek to bring forward and which, if any, we leave behind. It is a time to talk, to try new things,

Special Offerings


